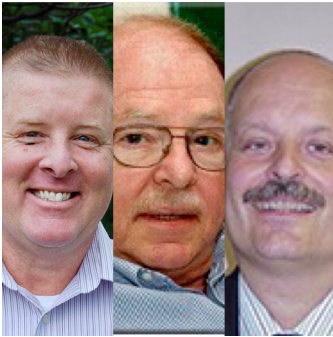
## Teletherapy Theory and Practice

- Considerations in systemically oriented telehealth (e.g., hearing the voices of all clients, engaging multiple clients in session)
- Managing systemically oriented therapeutic conversations in telehealth

#### Hour Three - Unique Challenges in Applying Telehealth Theory in Online Systemic Therapy Practice

- High conflict couples and families
- Working with children in families
- When suicidal and homicidal ideation emerges on the part of a family member participating in online systemic therapy
- Working with families and couples in which the level of comfort with online services differs from one family member to another.

Dale is a Professor of Marriage and Family Therapy at Abilene Christian University in Abilene, Texas. Dr. Bertram has offered the AAMFT Pre-Approved Supervision Refresher Course for the state Associations for Marriage and Family Therapy in Kentucky, Alabama and Texas, as well as for private supervision clients. Additionally, he routinely presents on Erickson Clinical Supervision, the Principles of MFT Ethics and is co-authoring a book on Ericksonian Supervision. Dr. Bertram is the author of a chapter in the "Users' Guide to the 2015 AAMFT Ethics Code" on technology assisted services.

Mike is an AAMFT Approved Supervisor who has a private practice in Louisville, KY. Mike formerly was the Executive Director of the Kentucky Association for Marriage and Family Therapy. He is a seasoned supervisor who routinely supervises a number of students and associates who are pursuing MFT licensure. Mike is an experienced workshop speaker, who has presented on MFT Ethics, Ericksonian supervision, and MFT supervision. He is currently co-authoring a book with Dr. Bertram on Eriksonian Supervision.
