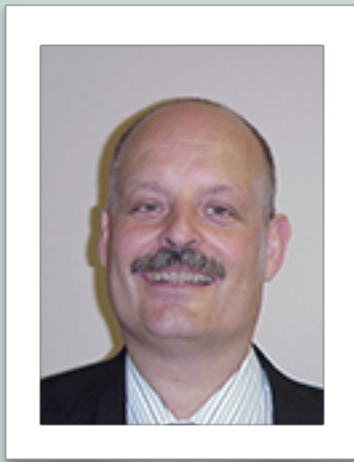

New technologies bring new ethical challenges to clinicians. In some cases, existing ethical practices can easily be adapted to fit new technological opportunities, but in others, the ethical way forward can be hard to identify. With frequently-changing codes of ethics surrounding use of technology, behavioral health practitioners must make sure that they are familiar with current issues.

This workshop, presented by Dr. Dale Bertram, looks at how the AAMFT Code of Ethics for Marriage and Family Therapists and the ACA Code of Ethics for Professional Counselors offer guidance in navigating new technological opportunities and challenges in our field. Dr. Dale Bertram, who is presenting this workshop wrote the chapter in the 2015 Users Guide to the AAMFT Code of Ethics on Technology Assisted Services.

Dale is a Professor of Marriage and Family Therapy at Abilene Christian University in Abilene, Texas.
